## The Graduate Admission Process

### APPLY ONLINE.

### A. GUIDELINES:

Graduates of colleges of recognized standing, whose records show evidence of ability to do graduate work, may apply for admission. Selection for all programs is based in the student's ability to do graduate work of high quality as shown by the distinction of the undergraduate record, particularly in the major, scores on appropriate admission tests, and/or other supporting documentation where required. All admission decisions are approved by the program director of the department in which the student plans to earn a graduate degree.

### B. PROCEDURES:

1. For individual program requirements, please refer to the complete "Graduate Program/Certificate Admission Requirements" in this brochure.
2. The application for admission must be completed in full and returned, along with the application fee (U.S. dollars only), to the Office of Admission Processing. **A non-refundable \$50 application fee must accompany all applications.**
3. Official transcripts of the undergraduate record, along with transcripts of any graduate work done elsewhere, must be forwarded directly to the Office of Admission Processing.
4. Include your Social Security number on all documentation submitted to the Office of Admission Processing.
5. Information regarding the GRE and the GMAT can be obtained from the Office of Graduate Admission or from ETS directly by contacting them at 609-921-9000 or visiting their Web site at [www.ets.org](http://www.ets.org).

### C. DEADLINES:

The deadline for application for the fall semester is July 15; for the spring semester, the date is November 15; and for summer sessions, the deadline is May 1. Qualified applicants are given consideration after the deadline on a space-available basis.

**NOTE:** Applications to the social work program are accepted until March 15 for fall ONLY. Applications to the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program are accepted until February 15 for summer start only. The following deadlines and start terms apply to **accelerated graduate programs**: MBA – 12-month program (fall start only, applications due July 15); TSD – 15-month program (spring start only, applications due November 15); MAT – 12-month program (summer start only, applications due May 1); MAT – 16- and 18-month programs (spring start only, applications due November 15).

### D. FINANCIAL AID/PAYMENT PLANS:

Two types of financial aid are available for graduate students at Monmouth University:

#### 1. NEED-BASED AID:

Federal Direct Subsidized Stafford Loan (Must be permanent resident or U.S. citizen)

#### 2. NON-NEED-BASED AID:

- a. Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan (Must be permanent resident or U.S. citizen)
- b. Graduate Assistantships
- c. Academic Scholarships\*

The Office of Financial Aid uses the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as its primary application for federal aid programs. For information about graduate assistantships, contact the Office of the Dean of the Graduate School at 732-571-7550.

The University offers a major payment plan through Tuition Management Systems (TMS). The plan offers 12-, 10-, or 8-month payment schedules, and even a 4-month plan for students attending for just one semester. \*Graduate fellowship awards are determined by baccalaureate cumulative grade point average. No additional application is necessary. Awards are made at the time of admission. For more information, please contact the Office of Graduate Admission at 732-571-3452.

### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

1. Applicants whose native language is not English must take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS). For graduate students, the requirements are: 550 for the paper-based TOEFL, 213 for the computer-based, and 79 for the Internet-based test. In addition to the TOEFL, Monmouth will accept the IELTS with a minimum score of 6, the Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB) with a minimum score of 77, or the Certificate of Advanced English (CAE) with a minimum score of a B2.
2. Financial documents and passport are required of all students seeking F-1 visa status.

4. The deadline for fall admission is June 1; the deadline for spring admission is November 1.

Submit official transcripts in English from all previously attended institutions. Transcripts must be translated into English and evaluated by an accredited translation/evaluation service. For required documentation, refer to our Web site or contact the Office of Graduate Admission.

### STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Any information you provide will be used only by the appropriate office and will not prejudice your application. You are not required to disclose a disability to the Office of Graduate Admission.

**CERTIFICATES:** Students may earn a certificate without matriculating into a degree program. In most cases the admission requirements are the same as for a degree program. In some cases a certificate may be included as part of a degree program in an appropriate specialty.

**NON-MATRICULATED COURSE WORK ONLY:** Student is NOT applying for a program of study. Course work is NOT permitted in MAT, MBA, MSW, or PC programs. Limit of 6 credits. Student must send official transcript showing conferral of bachelor's degree.

**PERMISSION:** Students attending another school who wish to register for a course(s) during the semester must have a letter of permission from the home institution.

### MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (MBA) with a Concentration in Healthcare Management

Regular Admission for all MBA programs (either of the following):

1. Possession of a four-year baccalaureate degree and either:
  - a. GMAT\* minimum score of 450, and a minimum total of 1,000 when a GMAT is added to 200 times the grade point average (GPA), or
  - b. GMAT minimum score of 500, or
  - c. CPA or CFA licensure

\*The Graduate Record Exam (GRE) will be considered as a substitute for the GMAT on an equivalent basis.

2. Possession of a Master's or Doctoral degree (MS, MD, JD, PhD, EdD, etc.).

*Exceptional or conditional acceptance may be granted to a small number of qualified applicants at the discretion of the MBA program director.*

### BUSINESS CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS:

#### Accounting and Healthcare Management (Post-Master's Certificates)

Possession of a Master's degree from an accredited institution within the last seven years, including the six business core courses.

*Exceptional admission may be granted at the discretion of the MBA program director.*

### MASTER OF ARTS IN TEACHING (MAT)

### ACCELERATED MASTER OF ARTS IN TEACHING (MAT)

#### All MAT Programs, Tracks, and Concentrations

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major.
2. Two letters of recommendation for graduate study.
3. Résumé.
4. Personal statement of not more than two pages that describes the applicant's preparation for study in the program and personal objectives for graduate study.

**Note:** Prior to student teaching, the appropriate Praxis Test must be successfully completed and all content courses and conditions of acceptance must be satisfied. Accelerated students must submit scores at time of application.

### MASTER OF EDUCATION (MEd)

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.5 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major.
2. Two letters of recommendation for graduate study.
3. Essay (500 words or more) explaining why the applicant wishes to pursue this graduate program.
4. Résumé.

### MASTER OF SCIENCE IN EDUCATION (MSEd)

Concentrations in Principal, Principal/School Administrator, Reading Specialist, School Counseling, Student Affairs and College Counseling, and Special Education

Tracks in Teacher of Students with Disabilities (TSD), Learning Disabilities Teacher-Consultant (LDT-C), Teaching in Inclusive Settings, or Autism

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major.
2. Two letters of recommendation related to the applicant's competence for this graduate program and professional work.
3. Essay (500 words or more) explaining why the applicant wishes to pursue this graduate program.

### Certification Requirements:

**Principal:** Upon completion, you must provide documentation evidencing completion of five years of successful educational experience under a valid provisional or standard NJ or equivalent out-of-state certificate to be eligible for the endorsement.

**School Administrator:** Upon completion, you must provide documentation evidencing completion of five years of successful educational experience in a public or non-public school, a public or non-public school district, or a regionally accredited higher educational setting in New Jersey or out-of-state.

**Reading Specialist:** Upon completion, you must provide documentation evidencing completion of two years successful teaching experience to be eligible for the endorsement.

**Teacher of Students with Disabilities (TSD):** Applicant must hold a certificate of eligibility with advanced standing (CEAS), provisional or standard NJ instructional certificate.

**Learning Disabilities Teacher-Consultant (LDT-C):** Upon completion, you must provide documentation evidencing completion of three years successful teaching experience with a standard NJ or out-of-state instructional certificate to be eligible for the endorsement.

**Inclusive Settings:** Must be a certified teacher.

**Autism:** Must be a certified teacher.

### EDUCATION CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS:

#### Autism

1. Bachelor's degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major.
2. Personal essay explaining why the candidate wants to pursue this degree.
3. Two letters of recommendation.

#### Curriculum Studies (Post-Master's)

#### Education (Post-Master's)

1. A minimum 3.0 GPA in a master's degree in education or a related field.

#### Educational Technology

1. Must be a certified teacher.
2. See MEd requirements.
3. Two letters of recommendation.

#### Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL)

#### Accelerated Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL)

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 or better overall GPA.

### EDUCATION ENDORSEMENT PROGRAMS:

#### Bilingual/Bicultural

1. A degree in a K-12 school curriculum content area.
2. Certificate of eligibility with advanced standing, or a standard NJ instructional certificate, or a certificate of eligibility with a teaching position in an ESL/Bilingual setting.
3. A passing score for nationally recognized test of oral and written proficiency in both English and the target language.

#### Chinese

1. A minimum of 30 credits in Chinese, which may include the art, culture, economics, history, and/or literature of China.
2. See MAT requirements.

#### Director of School Counseling Services (Post-Master's)

See MEd requirements.

**Note:** Must hold an NJ school counselor or student personnel services certificate or an equivalent out-of-state certificate and upon completion, provide documentation evidencing completion of three years of successful experience as a school counselor in grades P-12 to be eligible for the endorsement.

#### Early Childhood (Preschool through Grade 3)

See MEd requirements. (If the applicant is not a certified teacher, the applicant must hold an NJ certificate of eligibility (CE) P-3 and be employed in a P-3 position requiring certification.)

#### ESL and Accelerated ESL

As an endorsement of practitioners in the school districts:

1. A bachelor's degree (BA or BS) with a minimum 2.75 GPA.
2. Hold a certificate of eligibility with advanced standing (CEAS), provisional, or standard NJ instructional certificate. If applicant is not a certified teacher, the applicant must hold a NJ certificate of eligibility (CE) ESL and be employed in an ESL position requiring certification.

As an added part of an initial certificate program: Admission into any of the Monmouth University Initial Teaching Certification Programs (MAT).

#### **Learning Disabilities Teacher-Consultant (LDT-C) (Post-Master's)**

1. Possession of a master's degree in education.
2. See MSED requirements.

#### **Principal (Post-Master's)**

1. Possession of a master's degree with a minimum 3.0 GPA in the graduate major.
2. Two letters of recommendation.
3. Essay (500 words or more) explaining why the applicant wishes to pursue the post-master's endorsement program.
4. All official undergraduate and graduate transcripts.
5. See certification requirements under MSED.

#### **Reading Specialist (Post-Master's)**

See *Principal requirements*.

**Note:** Upon completion, you must provide documentation evidencing completion of two years successful teaching experience to be eligible for the endorsement.

#### **School Business Administration (Post-Master's)**

1. Hold a master's degree (in any field) OR
2. Hold a bachelor's degree and be in possession of a certified public accountant license.

#### **Substance Awareness Coordinator (SAC)**

1. Hold a standard instructional certificate, or a school psychologist, school social worker, school counselor, director of school counseling services or school nurse endorsement, or a valid Licensed Clinical Alcohol and Drug Counselor credential issued by the NJ Alcohol and Drug counselor Committee of the Marriage and Family Board, or a valid Certified Prevention Specialist credential issued by the Addiction Professionals Certification Board of NJ or hold a master's or higher degree from a regionally accredited college or university.
2. Applicant must submit an essay of 500 words or more explaining why applicant wishes to pursue a SAC endorsement.
3. Submit all official undergraduate and graduate transcripts.

**Note:** Monmouth University students who are pursuing one of the above credentials in #1, can apply to this program and pursue it concurrently with their degree.

#### **Supervisor (Post-Master's)**

1. Possession of a master's degree.
2. See MSED requirements.

**Note:** Applicant must hold a standard New Jersey instructional or educational services certificate or its out-of-state equivalent, and complete three years of successful, full-time teaching and/or educational services experience. Teaching and/or educational services experience completed in a New Jersey public school must have been under an appropriate New Jersey certificate.

#### **MASTER OF ARTS IN ANTHROPOLOGY (MA)**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or University with a minimum 3.0 GPA.
2. Essay (500 words) highlighting personal and /or professional goals and objectives for wanting to pursue graduate study in the field of anthropology.
3. Two professional letters of recommendation from persons familiar with the prospective student's academic and/or professional competence.

#### **MASTER OF ARTS IN CORPORATE & PUBLIC COMMUNICATION (MA)**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major.
2. Two letters of recommendation for graduate study.
3. Personal essay of not more than 750 words that describes the applicant's preparation for study in the program and personal objectives for graduate study.
4. Portfolio of experience that demonstrates a record of independent initiative and achievement in academic, career, and/or community settings. (Applicants who have earned an undergraduate degree the previous year must submit scores from the GRE.)
5. Résumé.

#### **MASTER OF ARTS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE (MA) Track in Homeland Security (Optional)**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.5 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major.
2. Two letters of recommendation for graduate study.
3. Personal essay of 250 to 300 words that describes your preparation for study in the program and personal objectives for graduate study in criminal justice.

#### **MASTER OF ARTS IN ENGLISH (MA)**

**Tracks in Creative Writing, Literature, New Jersey Studies, and Rhetoric and Writing**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA and at least 15 credits in literary studies is strongly recommended.
2. Two letters of recommendation from former professors, current colleagues, or a current or recent supervisor.
3. An application essay of 500 words describing your personal objectives for graduate study in a master of arts program, as well as research completed, in progress, or contemplated, or an author or period of particular interest.

#### **MASTER OF ARTS IN HISTORY (MA)**

**Optional Tracks in European Specialization, U.S. Specialization, and World Specialization**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.5 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major.
2. Two letters of recommendation for graduate study.
3. Written statement that describes the historical areas the candidate wishes to study and details how graduate study will contribute to the candidate's professional and academic goals.

#### **MASTER OF ARTS IN PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING (MA)**

**Optional Track in Addiction Studies**

#### **MASTER OF SCIENCE IN MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING (MS)**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 3.0 overall GPA.
2. Two completed Monmouth University psychological counseling recommendation forms, which can be obtained at [www.applyweb.com/apply/monmouth/pdfs/PsychologicalCounselingReferenceForm.pdf](http://www.applyweb.com/apply/monmouth/pdfs/PsychologicalCounselingReferenceForm.pdf).
3. Twenty-four credits in psychology (including courses in personality theory, statistics, abnormal psychology, and research methods).
4. Narrative (four to five pages, double spaced) in response to the questions outlined on the Admission Application Essay Form, which can be obtained at <http://www.monmouth.edu/admission/graduate/PYessay.pdf>.
5. GRE scores may be required. Candidates who have not yet taken the GRE may be accepted conditionally pending satisfactory completion of the requirement during the first nine credits of study. Candidates with a master's degree in a related field are not required to submit GRE scores.

#### **MASTER OF ARTS IN PUBLIC POLICY (MA)**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA.
2. Two-page typewritten personal statement (approximately 500 words) highlighting personal and/or professional goals and objectives for pursuing graduate study in the field of public policy and public affairs.
3. Two letters of recommendation from persons familiar with the prospective student's academic and/or professional competence.

## **MARJORIE K. UNTERBERG SCHOOL OF NURSING AND HEALTH STUDIES**

#### **DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE (DNP)**

1. Applicants must be a graduate of an accredited Master's in Nursing Program.
2. Possession of an active RN license.
3. National certification in the specialization as a Nurse Practitioner or Nurse Administrator.
4. Must have a minimum GPA of 3.2 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

5. Have completed a graduate research course with a working knowledge of graduate statistics.
6. Submit a letter of intent indicating professional goals and a vision for change.
7. Résumé.
8. Two professional and/or academic letters of recommendation.
9. Official transcripts from all previous college work.
10. Personal interview (telephone interview when appropriate) with the DNP Director.

#### **MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (MSN)**

##### **Specializations in Adult Nurse Practitioner, Adult Psychiatric and Mental Health, Family Nurse Practitioner, Forensic Nursing, Nursing Administration, Nursing Education, and School Nursing**

1. Possession of a BSN from an accredited program, with a minimum 2.75 GPA. RN students with a baccalaureate degree other than nursing may be admitted into the "bridge" program.
2. GRE scores may be waived pending a minimum of a "B" (3.0) earned in each of the first four courses of the program. Satisfactory GRE scores will be required to continue if a "B" is not earned in each of the first four courses.
3. A personal statement (one to two pages) outlining professional goals.
4. Two letters of recommendation. One year of clinical experience is necessary to begin the clinical specialty.
5. A college-level course in health assessment. (An appropriate continuing education course may be substituted at the program director's discretion.) This requirement does not apply to the Nursing Administration concentration.
6. A current New Jersey RN license, a year of experience as a registered nurse, and proof of a current \$1,000,000 to \$3,000,000 liability and malpractice policy.
7. Résumé.

#### **NURSING CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS:**

##### **Advanced Practice Nursing (Post-Master's)**

##### **Specializations in Adult Nurse Practitioner, Adult Psychiatric and Mental Health, Family Nurse Practitioner, Nursing Administration, and Nursing Education**

1. Possession of a master's degree in nursing.
2. A current New Jersey RN license, a year of current experience as a registered nurse, and proof of a current \$1,000,000 to \$3,000,000 liability and malpractice policy.
3. A personal statement (one to two pages) outlining professional goals.
4. Two letters of recommendation. One year of clinical experience is necessary to begin the clinical specialty.
5. A college-level course in health assessment. (An appropriate continuing education course may be substituted at the program director's discretion.) This requirement does not apply to the nursing administration concentration.
6. Résumé.

##### **Forensic Nursing; School Nursing; School Nursing (Non-Instructional)**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 GPA.
2. A current New Jersey RN license, a year of experience as a registered nurse, and proof of a current \$1,000,000 to \$3,000,000 liability and malpractice policy.

## SCHOOL OF SCIENCE

#### **MASTER OF SCIENCE IN COMPUTER SCIENCE (MS)**

##### **Optional tracks in Computer Networks, Databases and Intelligent Information Systems, and Security of Computer Systems and Networks**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major, preferably in the sciences or engineering.
2. Two letters of recommendation for graduate study.
3. Two semesters of calculus (I and II) with grades of "C" or better.
4. Two semesters of computer programming courses within the past five years (equivalent to Monmouth's CS175 and CS176) at a recognized institution with a grade of "B" or better.

#### **COMPUTER SCIENCE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM:**

##### **Software Design and Development**

See MS requirements.

#### **MASTER OF SCIENCE IN FINANCIAL MATHEMATICS (MS)**

1. Undergraduate degree in mathematics or in a related field that requires a substantial component of mathematics such as physics, computer engineering, or electrical engineering. Business, computer science, or related majors with a minor in mathematics are also acceptable. (*Applicants who have not previously completed courses in calculus, linear algebra, differential equations, or statistics will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis, and may be required to complete a foundation curriculum.*)
2. Must have completed Calculus, I, II, and III; Linear Algebra; Differential Equations (with some exposure to partial differential equations); and a course in calculus-based statistics.
3. Must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in your major, and a minimum 2.5 GPA or better overall.

#### **MASTER OF SCIENCE IN SOFTWARE ENGINEERING (MS)**

##### **Optional Advanced Thesis or Non-Thesis Track**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree in software engineering, computer science, computer engineering, or another engineering related discipline with a minimum 2.5 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major. Candidates whose major is not computer science or a related field may be admitted on a case-by-case basis.
2. Demonstrate completed course work in computer programming, data structures and algorithms, and software engineering. Applicants who have not completed course work in these areas will be required to complete the preparatory/foundation courses as necessary.
3. Thesis track students must hold a bachelor's degree in software engineering from a college or university accredited by its regional accrediting agency.

## SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

#### **MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK (MSW)**

##### **Tracks in International and Community Development, and Clinical Practice with Families and Children**

1. Possession of a baccalaureate degree with a minimum 2.75 overall GPA and a minimum 3.0 GPA in the undergraduate major. Social work education is grounded in the liberal arts and contains a coherent, integrated professional foundation in social work (CSWE Accreditation Standards). MSW applicants with a baccalaureate degree are required to have a strong liberal arts background with a minimum of one 3-credit course in each of the four areas of English, math, biology, and psychology. None of these four classes may be a CLEP\*, they must be taken as college-level credit bearing classes. The program also prefers course work in history, sociology, political science, anthropology, and economics. \*CLEP College-Level Examination Program®
2. Three completed Monmouth University Department of Social Work recommendation forms, which can be obtained at [www.monmouth.edu/admission/graduate/MSWRefForm.pdf](http://www.monmouth.edu/admission/graduate/MSWRefForm.pdf). Recommendations must be submitted by professional or academic references, and not by friends or relatives.
3. Narrative (four to five pages, double spaced) in response to the questions outlined on the Autobiographical Statement Form, which can be obtained at [www.monmouth.edu/admission/graduate/MSWAutobioStatement.pdf](http://www.monmouth.edu/admission/graduate/MSWAutobioStatement.pdf).
4.
