Phi Sigma Sigma and Monmouth University contributed their time in helping the Haiti relief cause. Phi Sigma Sigma collaborated and set up a

donation table on campus and gave pins to those who donated money in support of Haiti. Phi Sigma Sigma also worked at the women's basketball game and collected

money for the Haiti cause. In total, \$258.70 was raised; \$198 from the basketball game and \$60.70 from the donation table. Monmouth University together raised over \$500. The money

was sent to Partners in Health, UNICEF, and the American Red Cross.
