

a profit on their investments, but hosto maintain their business at all, hosto best to stave off complete economicollapse.

Organized industry and organizelabor, each granting and fully recognizing the rights and prerogatives of the other, should take the leadership in guaranteeing freedom from want fo all. They should not oppose but rathe encourage the government to maintain at least a minimum of security for all. They need not fear government, for. with the people's basic needs provided for, the government will be ruled by the people and not the other way about. Once again our system of checks and balances will come into free play, and will not be subjected to the stresses of a citizenry suffering business failure. hunger and deprivation. A citizenry that is strong, independent and securmakes for a strong but flexible government, strong enough to protect the people, but not so all-powerful as to dominate them.

The government's role in a planned economy such as foresighted leaders of labor and industry envisage will be that of a traffic cop regulating the flow of industry so as to avoid snarls and collisions. The traffic cop may direct the lumbering road hog to move to onside and permit speedier machines to move ahead. He may restrain the reckless driver from committing injury to himself and bringing disaster to others. But the traffic officer does not himself own and drive every machine, nor does he have authority beyond that prescribed in the traffic regulations.

Enlightened free enterprise working intelligently with organized free labor, therefore, need not fear government or the crippling hand of official bureaucracy. Certain communal services are best performed by a communal agency. Streets are laid and roads are built by governmental agencies. Water supplies and sewage systems are maintained in modern cities by government agencies. We have an Interstate Commerce Commission to police the transportation industry and a Federal Trade Commission to maintain ethical relations in business. Only the industrial anarchist, the unsocial individualist
