WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION:


This presentation will focus on the present and historical barriers to equity in western society. Slavery and segregation were not the products of determined individual actors. Systems of profit and informal rewards created institutions dedicated to injustice around the world. These systems have changed in superficial ways over the last fifty years. How can today's leaders accomplish more, despite these longstanding traditions?

PRESENTER:



Walter D. Greason, PhD is Dean Emeritus of the Honors School and Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Educational Counseling and Leadership at Monmouth University. Dr. Greason served as the founding president of the T. Thomas Fortune Community Center, a national historic landmark dedicated to the most militant journalist of the nineteenth century. His nine books address sustainable ways to achieve social justice on a global scale, and his new project – Sojourners Trail – is an interactive, web-based game that teaches players about the Black Speculative Arts Movement in historical and geographic contexts.
