Honors Clusters, Courses, and Sections

The Honors School offers clustered and individual courses and sections in the following formats:

- Honors *courses* (designated HO),
- Honors *sections of regular courses* (designated by an H preceding the course's section number)
- Honors *credit by contract in regular courses* (arranged by the student and professor)

Clustered Courses: Students should enroll in both courses in a cluster.

Cluster 1: *Different Ways of Knowing: Myth, Philosophy, Religion, Science*

Students in this Honors cluster will examine the various ways that humankind has used to understand nature, society and social hierarchies, the role of women, the state and the individual, and systems of morality. In Western Civilization 1, the focus will be on close reading of original texts from the ancient world through the 17th century. Reading and writing assignments in College Composition 1 will consider the extent to which these ways of knowing still contribute to our understanding of ourselves and the world around us. In both courses, these ideas will be discussed in a seminar format and expressed in analytical writing.

Cluster 2: *It's getting wild!*

Cross-cultural and psychological perspectives on the human-animal relationship

The cluster will focus on the unique and fascinating relationship between humans and non-human animals, from both cultural and psychological perspectives. We will explore many interesting questions such as: What roles do animals play in society and why does the value we place on different species vary by culture? What are the psychological benefits of the human-animal relationship? How have our views evolved throughout history, and impacted by globalization and advancements in technology? We will explore our cluster theme through the use of journal articles, film, lecture, discussion, class presentations/papers, a class trip and experiential assignments.

Cluster 3: *The Role of Music in Our Lives*

In the Music/English cluster students will learn about music terminology, instruments and ensembles, and 2500 years of Western music history. Music will be placed in the context of the broader world of the arts, with frequent reference to great works of literature and fine arts that were so inspiring to composers over the years. The course encourages a deeper understanding and appreciation of the wonder and mysteries of music.
