A Brief History

- Established in 1946 by Congress, Fulbright is the United States government's flagship international educational and cultural exchange program.
- Fulbright is sponsored by the U.S.
 Department of State with funding provided by the U.S. Government and administered by the Institute of International Education.







Diversity and Inclusion

Fulbright strives to ensure that it reflects the diversity of U.S. society and societies abroad. We encourage the involvement of people from traditionally underrepresented audiences in all our grants, programs and other initiatives.

Opportunities are open to people regardless of their race, color, national origin, sex, age, religion, geographic location, socioeconomic status, disability, sexual orientation or gender identity.







Why Fulbright?

Fulbright is transformational.

- Foster relationships that are real and lasting
- Expand your publishing network
- Become more multicultural in the classroom
- Serve as an ambassador for international exchange
- Gain the professional recognition as being identified as a "Fulbright Scholar"
- Join a vibrant alumni network

Fulbright is family-friendly.

- Approximately 60% of our awards provide dependent support
- Many Fulbright dependents go on to have international careers

Fulbright is supportive.

- 70% of applicants engage with IIE staff
- Continued support while in country from IIE and host country staff
- Access to Fulbright alumni as a resource







Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Program



- U.S. citizenship
- Degree and experience, as required by award:
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree
 - MA and higher education teaching or professional experience
 - Professional and/or artistic experience with substantial accomplishments
 - Teaching experience
- Compliance with <u>policies</u> on previous Fulbright Scholar awards and waiting periods between grants







Fulbright by the Numbers

The Fulbright Program funds over 8,000 awards annually:

- 900 U.S. scholars and administrators
- 900 visiting scholars
- 2,200 U.S. students
- 4,000 foreign students
- 400+ language teaching assistants

Approximately 400,000 "Fulbrighters" have participated in the program since its inception in 1946.






Distribution of Awards 2021-22

Selecting the Right Award




- Match expertise, experience and proposal to the award description
- Regional experience and language ability
- Discipline preferences, when specified
- Is the project relevant to the host country? How will communities benefit from your project?
- Career level postdoctoral, early career, mid-career,
 Distinguished Chair, administrator









Affiliations and Invitations

In the award description: a host institutions may or may not be identified

LOCATIONS

Applicants may affiliate with one of the following institutions:

- University of Oran-2 in Oran
- University of Algiers-2 in Algiers

LOCATIONS

Any accredited institution of higher education in Argentina.

- When a host is not identified, there are several resources to help find an affiliation:
 - Review award description for suggested hosts or resources
 - U.S. and Visiting Fulbright Scholar Directory
 - International office on your campus







Affiliations and Invitations



Application Requirements

INVITATION REQUIREMENT

A letter of invitation is required

- Non-binding expression of interest from proposed host abroad
- Should come from person with whom you will be collaborating
- Should be on host institution letterhead



Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship


- Opportunities for U.S. early and mid-career professionals and practitioners in a Public Policy related field, to serve in placements in a foreign government ministry or institution around the world.
- Fulbright Public Policy Fellowships are available in:
 - Africa: Botswana, Ghana, and Rwanda
 - East Asia and the Pacific: Cambodia, Thailand, Vietnam, Timor-Leste, and Fiji
 - Western Hemisphere: Peru and Colombia
- A Project Statement is not required. Applicants complete a short series of essay questions. Letter of Affiliations are not sought.
- Fellows will work with ministry officials as "technical specialists" under the supervision of host government officials.

Application Components

Requirements:

- Application Form
- Project Statement
- Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- 2 Letters of Recommendation
- Language Proficiency Report (if required)
- Letter of Invitation (if required)

Supplemental Materials:

- Course outlines or syllabi (for teaching)
- Select bibliography (for research)
- Portfolio submissions (for artists, architects, and journalists)







Tips to submit a strong application:

- Before you start, read your award's description carefully to ensure you meet all requirements and your proposed project is possible.
- Start your application and enter your referees' information as soon as possible. You can always save and return to it.
- Take advantage of IIE resources, including webinars, office hours and pointed application guidance on our website.

Remember: You only can receive an award if you apply!







Project Statement

- Describe your proposed project in 3 5 pages.
- Focus on what you plan to do, the specific courses you plan to teach, the goals of your research, your methods.
- Explain the anticipated impact of your award on your hosts, home institution and you.

Supplemental Questions

- Why Fulbright? (1,000 characters)
- Why this country? (2,000 characters)
- How adaptable are you? How well will you deal with challenging situations? (1,000 characters)
- How will you adapt your materials for your host culture (2,000 characters)







Application Cycle

2023-24 Competition Now Open

FEBRUARY	Catalog of Awards Opens
SEPTEMBER 15	Application Deadline
SEPTEMBER	Program staff conducts technical reviews for completeness
OCTOBER – NOVEMBER	U.S. peer review
NOVEMBER – JANUARY	Applicants notified of status. Recommended applications are sent to host countries and to the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board.
JANUARY – APRIL	Final decisions are made
MAY – ONWARD	Participants prepare for departure

Ukraine 2019-2020

- Sixth year of conflict with Russian occupation
- Severe humanitarian impacts
- Continued insecurity has interrupted industry and impacted jobs, service delivery, infrastructure, and urban development
- Years of conflict have left people traumatized and anxious
- Mental health services are limited and difficult to access and the need for psychosocial support is continuously increasing



The Plan: 1



National University Kyiv Mohyla Academy

- Develop and teach one course each semesters (3)
 - Advanced International Community Practice: Environment & Sustainability
 - Social Innovation & Social Enterprise
 - Social Work in Emergencies
- Capacity Building
 - Start movement for Ukrainian National Association of Social Workers
 - Faculty and curriculum development
 - Assist in the integration of psychosocial support into disaster services and response
 - Build psychosocial support initiative for COVID-19 pandemic

The Plan: 2



Ukrainian National Red Cross

 - Develop Volunteer Psychosocial Support Training Program
 - Train the Trainer Model

 - Warm Line Volunteer Training & Support







Ukrainian Red Cross Society

- 630 district and city-and-district branches

- 4 million members of the Society (2019)








A kit for training at the level of the first psychological aid



- In 2019 a training course for psychological first aid trainers was organized.
- The volunteers who have successfully undergone the training will be sent to settlements in the east of Ukraine to train local community representatives with the skills of providing first aid and first aid to children
- Trained trainers will be able to conduct trainings for volunteers and staff members.













