What is Speech?

According to the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, there are 3 aspects of speech.

Articulation is how humans form words using the tongue, lips, and mouth.

Voice is how humans use our vocal chords and breath to make sound. Using these, humans can make their voice loud or soft, high or low pitched.

Fluency is the rate at which we speak, which may be fast or slow.
