

- The Haitian diet has changed during the study period with a **16**% increase in caloric intake coming from rice.
- Rice is the subject of many governmental polices that have proved consequential to Haiti's food system.

## Results

#### **Trade Liberalization**

- Decreases in import tariffs led to a surge in imports, particularly from subsidized American farmers. This had detrimental impacts on Haiti's domestic production capabilities Altidor (2004), Wisner (2022).
- Some scholars reject this stating that the increase in imports cannot be attributed to the tariff decrease and rather was triggered by the increasing population Lundahl (2014).

## Haiti's reliance on rice imports makes them vulnerable to:

- International food price spikes, fluctuations in the value of the Haitian Gourde, and loss of agricultural income Wisner (2022).
- The import of large quantities of cheap rice put rural farmers out of business, restricting domestic food supply to cheap imports, increasing food insecurity over time (Wisner 2022).
- Recent studies found unhealthy levels of arsenic in imported rice Goodrich (2024).
