Admission Requirements

Traditional Application Pathway

1. Submit a completed application through the Communication Science and Disorders Centralized Application Service (CSDCAS (<http://www.capsd.org/csdcas-student-page/>)) along with the signed SLP Communication Standards form and \$50 application fee submitted to Monmouth University.
2. An earned baccalaureate degree with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale from all courses at all institutions; A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 in all Speech-Language Pathology prerequisite

courses (does not include non-SLP prerequisites, e.g., statistics); and Competitive applicants have GPA's of 3.3 or better.

3. Essay (500 words or more) explaining why the student wishes to pursue a career in Speech-Language Pathology.
4. Two professional letters of recommendation.
5. Submission of a professional résumé.
6. Candidates must be able to communicate effectively in order to meet ASHA's standards of clinical competence. Specifically, successful candidates "must have demonstrated communication skills sufficient to achieve effective clinical and professional interaction with clients/patients and relevant others." 7. Completion of eighteen (18) credits of speech-language pathology prerequisite courses with a minimum GPA of 3.0 across all SLP prerequisite courses. Applicants must also fulfill ASHA requirements listed at <https://www.asha.org/Certification/Course-Content-Areas-for-SLP-Standards/>.
