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

The method used to calculate the graduation rates was the same method the National Center for
Educational Statistics created for our Federal IPEDS reports. Students were grouped into Cohorts depending on whether they entered in the same fall or spring. For the fall cohorts, a year extends
from fall to August 30. So for students entering in the Fall of 2015, graduation by August 30, 2016
would count as 1 year, graduation by August 30, 2017 would count as 2 years, etc. By extension, for students entering in the spring, the year would extend to the end of the fall semester (in our case,
graduation in January).

What adjustments have you made to your program, if any, due to DEI requirements at your institution or in your state?

As a social justice focused program, we have infused the Multicultural and Social Justice Competencies throughout all of our curriculum. As a result, we have an intentional awareness on viewing our program objectives through a lens which takes into account a multicultural and pluralistic society. Furthermore, the program reflects the present and future needs of a culturally pluralistic society by implementing academic curriculum and fieldwork that integrates social justice competencies, race advocacy, and diversity implications at each level. All students are required to complete a multicultural counseling course, EDC 535 Diversity and Social Justice that focuses on specialized, experiential projects in racial/ ethnic/ sexual identity. Additionally, all students are

required to take a course that focuses on societal inequities that incorporates means for social justice advocacy for students, EDC 520 Advanced Topics in Race and Racism. Both of these courses address themes of racism, racial micro-aggressions, and oppression in our society. Program faculty accomplishes this by therapeutically processing potential cultural bias, discussing stereotypical attitudes of culture/race, with an integration of contemporary racial identity models. Courses are taught within a paradigm that reflects the increasing diversity in our schools, agencies, universities, and mental health centers. While there is this infusion throughout the teaching to achieve all of the objectives, specific objectives that note this at face value include: • To facilitate the knowledge of atrisk populations and application of resiliency utilizing a developmental perspective across the lifespan.
• To impart knowledge of self with exploration into culture, diversity, and converging identities.
