From the Dean's Desk - Dr. Janet Mahoney

The School of Nursing and Health Studies has had a very busy and productive fall semester. The University's first winter graduation was held in the Multipurpose Activity Center (MAC) on January 14th. Faculty, friends and family gathered to honor the accomplishments of twenty-two School of Nursing and Health Studies graduates. All spoke very highly of the winter ceremony and many expressed gratitude for the clear, crisp winter day, which was sandwiched between two winter storms.

Also noteworthy, we are preparing to welcome our first class into the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program. The program, which is primarily online, will include executive-style weekend meetings twice a semester. Beginning in May 2011, the first course, *Translating Evidence into Clinical Practice*, will be taught by Dr. Barbara Johnston. Dr. Mary Ann Troiano and Dr. Rose Knapp will team teach *Health Promotion in Diverse Populations* this summer. The first doctoral program to be offered at Monmouth University, the DNP will prepare nurses for leadership at the highest level of practice.

The Independent College Fund of New Jersey - Becton Dickinson grant funded the Certified Home Health Aide (CHHA) course which is being taught by Dr. Laura Kelly for the first time this semester. Another will be offered as a professional development program in July. See inside this newsletter for dates and details.

We saw growth in all of our nursing and health studies programs in 2010. Many of our new programs have done very well. Ballroom Dance continues to be one of our most popular physical education activity courses, with both sections filled for the Spring 2011 semester. We continue our exploration of the feasibility of several new courses and programs aimed at enhancing our current offerings and meeting the needs of the ever-changing health care arena.

I look forward to seeing students and alumni at the School's *Center for Professional Development in Nursing and Health Studies'* Second Annual Distinguished Speaker Program. Mathy Mezey will lecture on *Care of the Elderly Looking Back and Looking Forward* on June 7th.

Faculty Feature: Tresa Kaur Dusaj, Ph.D. (c.), RN-BC

Assistant Professor Tresa Kaur Dusaj, Ph.D.(c.), RN-BC joined the School of Nursing in the Fall of 2009, and quickly became known for her expertise in technology. In fact, during her summer break last year she took the ANCC national certification exam in Informatics and became one of the 700 nurses in the country certified in this specialty. She explains, "Professionally, I have several strong interests: technology (social media, Web 2.0 and on-line teaching), Pediatric Nursing, Nursing Education and research." As the coordinator of the Nursing Education track, she shares these interests with students incorporating technology into the classroom. While technology is a passion, Professor Dusaj is quick to remind that she remains a pediatric clinician at heart. She sees her ongoing involvement in the clinical arts as essential in Nursing Education.



Professor Dusaj is near completion of her Doctorate in Nursing from
Rutgers University. Her research is on the use of simulation in Nursing Education. This spring she
received the competitive Monmouth University Grant in Aid for Creativity Award. Her funded project
is titled, Pilot Study: A Descriptive Study of PDA Use on Graduate Student Self-Efficacy. This research
involves current students and explores the utilization of PDAs (personal digital assistants) in the
Nursing Education curriculum. Clearly Professor Dusaj is navigating the Nursing Education program into
the digital future!



Professor Mezey is Professor Emerita, Senior Research Associate and Director of The Hartford Institute for Geriatric Nursing at New York University's College of Nursing. Dr. Mezey has authored 11 books and has over 80 publications that focus on the preparation of baccalaureate and advance practice nurses to care for older adults, nursing practice with older adults and bioethical issues that affect decisions at the end of life. Dr. Mezey is editor for the Springer Series on Geriatric Nursing and co-editor for the Springer Publications *Evidenced-Based*

Geriatric Nursing Protocols for Best Practice and The Encyclopedia of Elder Care.
