These projects, designed to synthesize and integrate healthcare improvement measures, are completed during the final two semesters.

The Center applied for and received renewal of our provider status this past April. We are pleased to remain an approved provider of continuing nursing education by the NJSNA, an accredited approver, by the American Nurses Credentialing Center's Commission on Accreditation. I thank the members of the Advisory Committee for their contribution toward the application process and their support throughout the year. Several new initiatives and partnerships came to fruition this spring. NJ's Perinatal Consortium held a Research Conference on Campus, June 7<sup>th</sup> and the American Nurse Credentialing Center provided a Nurse Practitioner Review Courses for both Adult and Family certification exams in June at Monmouth University.

Our first totally online continuing education course, *Prescribing Controlled Substances*, is now available. It is designed to meet continuing education requirements for prescriptive privileges of the Advanced Practice Nurse in NJ. This summer, we also offered our first *Nurse Practitioner Boot Camp*, which was held on July 13 and 14. This skills immersion program provided X-Ray Interpretation, EKG Assessment, Care of Common Orthopedic Injuries, and Suturing and Wound Closure.
