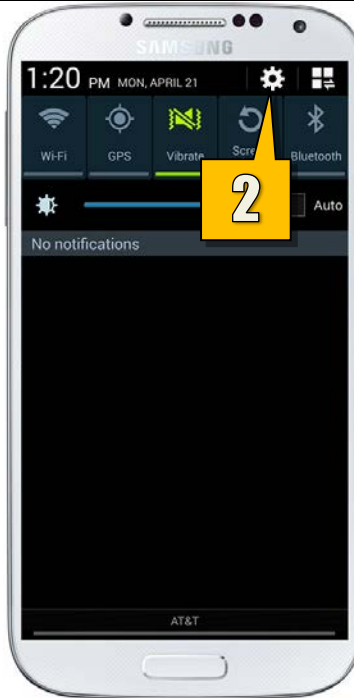

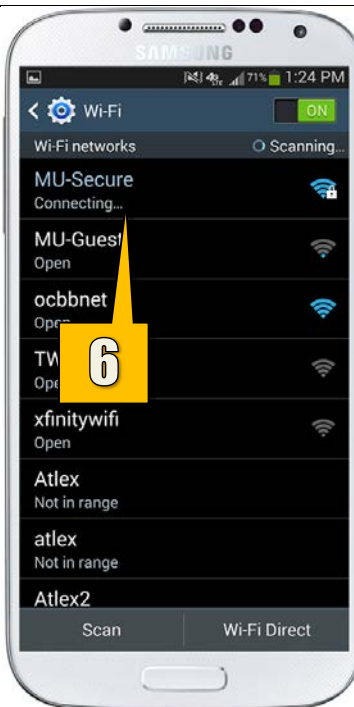
## Updating your Wi-Fi and Email Passwords on a Samsung Galaxy S4 Android Device

### Updating your Wireless (MU-Secure) Password



If you recently changed your **Monmouth University** password, you will need to update the **password** within your **MU-Secure Wi-Fi** settings and **Email** settings (steps 12 - 20)...

1. While on your **Home Screen**, slide down from the top to bring down the **notifications** screen.
2. Tap the **Settings** icon.

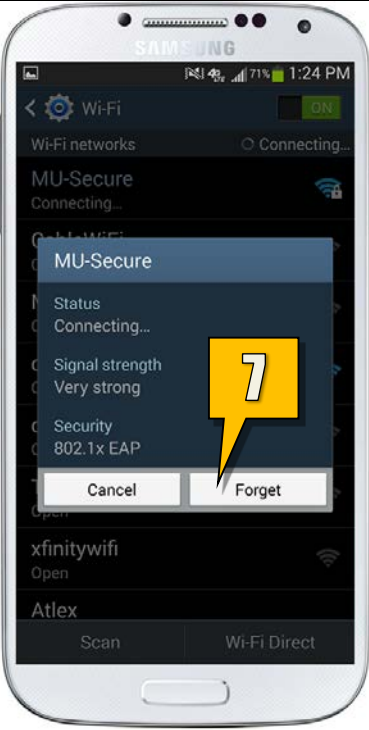
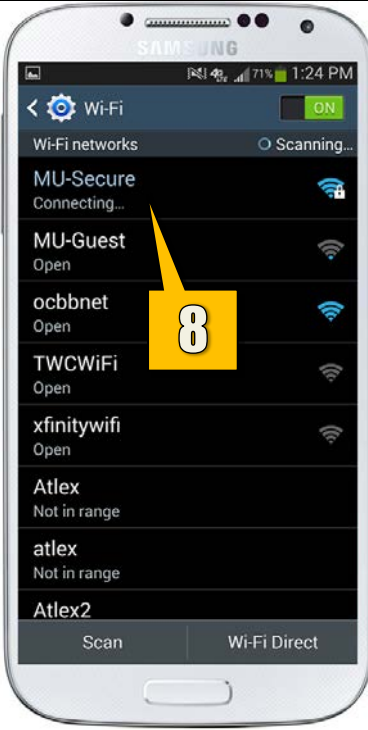

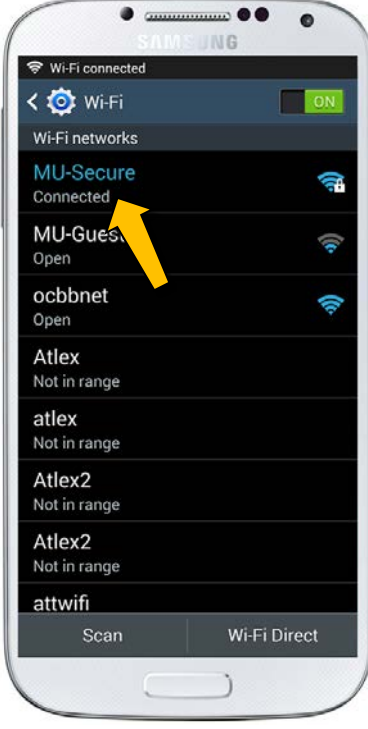


3. Tap the **Connections** tab.
4. Make sure your **Wi-Fi** toggle is set to **ON**.
5. Tap **Wi-Fi**.

On the **Wi-Fi** screen...

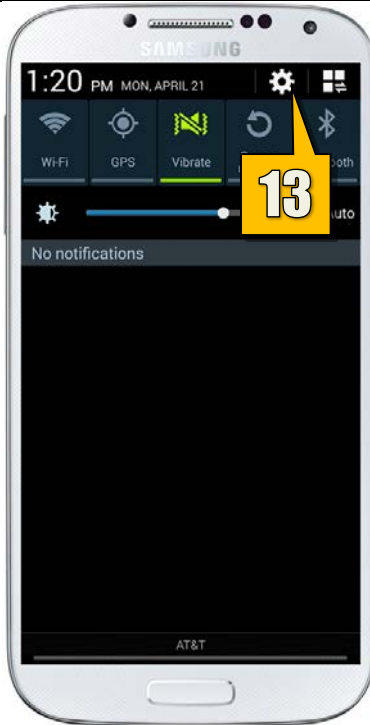
6. Tap **MU-Secure**.

Type your new <b>password</b> into the <b>Password</b> field.</li><li>11. Tap <b>Connect</b>.</li></ol> <p><b>MU-Secure</b> should reconnect with your updated <b>password</b>.</p> |

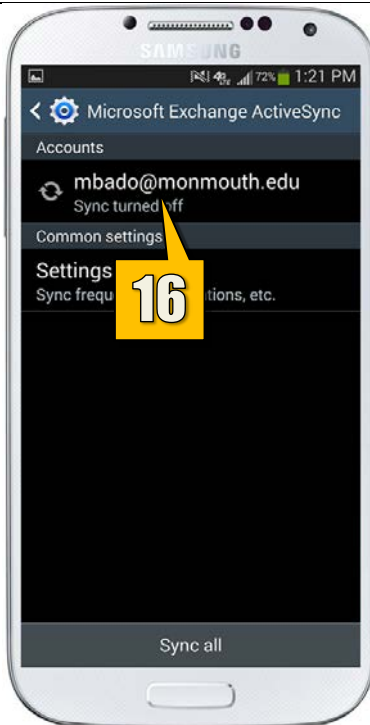
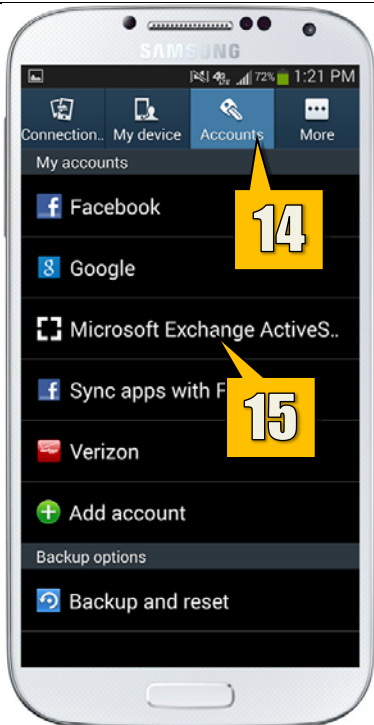

## Updating your Email Password



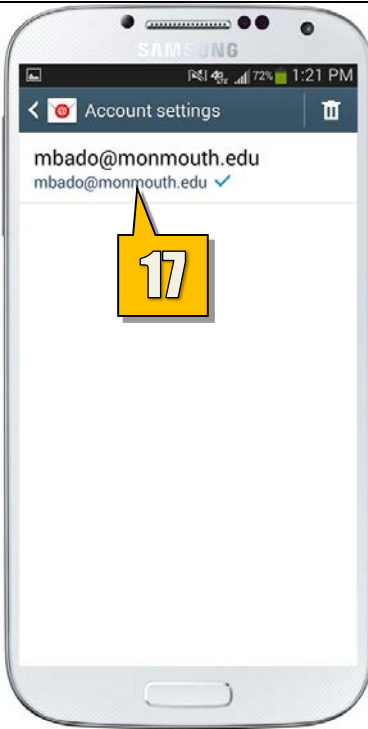
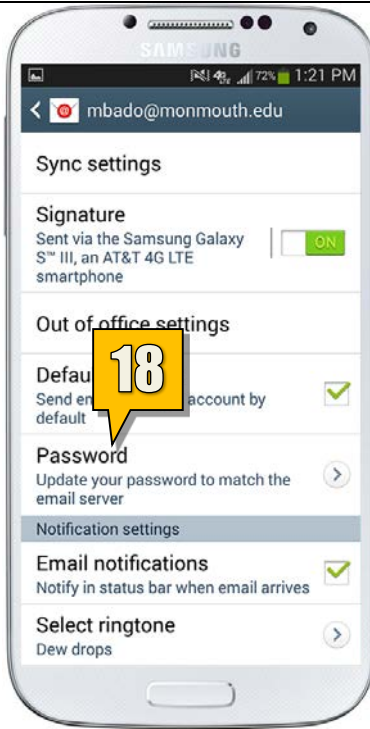

Once you change your **password**, the **Monmouth University Email** account that is configured on your device will need to have its **password** settings updated...

12. While on your **Home Screen**, slide down from the top to bring down the **notifications** screen.
13. Tap the **Settings** icon.



14. Tap the **Accounts** tab.
15. Tap on **Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync** (this may say **Exchange** or just **ActiveSync**).
16. Tap on the **account** you need to update.
